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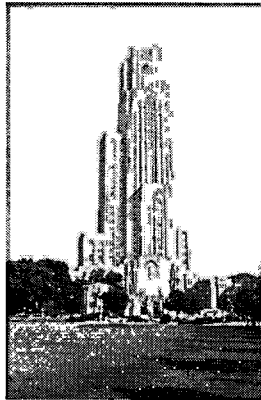

Freshman Year:

- Students are required to take Intro to Cultural Anthropology. It is a prerequisite for many upper level classes.
- Consider taking Biocultural Anthropology, World Music, any global history course, Art History, or getting started on a second language,

Sophomore Year:

- Consider studying abroad on anthropology- focused programs like Pitt in the Himalayas, Pitt in China, and Pitt in Ecuador.

- Consider taking some upper level courses like:

- ⇒ Language and Culture
- ⇒ Cultures of Africa
- ⇒ Japanese Society
- ⇒ Anthropology of Work and Play

- ⇒ Anthropology of Eurasia

Junior Year:
